§ 160-1. License required. ¹

- A. It shall be unlawful for any owner, manager or agent of a circus, carnival, or menagerie to exhibit the same in the Village of Spring Green without first procuring a license therefor in the manner hereinafter set forth. The license fee for each day shall be as set by the Village Board.
- B. It shall be unlawful for any owner, manager, or agent of a so-called side show, traveling vaudeville, Ferris wheel, or similar device, or so-called rides operated for amusement, or transient shooting gallery or curiosity, to operate or exhibit the same without first procuring a license therefore in the manner hereinafter set forth. The license fee for each day shall be as set by the Village Board.

§ 160-2. Application for license.

Application for any license required by § 160-1 shall be in writing and filed with the Village Clerk-Treasurer, which application shall state in detail the nature and character of the exhibition or amusement, the name and address of the owner and operator, the date or dates for which the license is desired, and the location of the premises where the proposed exhibition or amusement is intended to be conducted. All such applications shall be presented to the Village Board for approval or rejection. The proper license fee shall be paid to the Village Clerk-Treasurer prior to the issuance of any license by the Village Clerk-Treasurer.

§ 160-3. Violations and penalties. ²

Any person who shall violate any provision of § 160-1 or 160-2 shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than \$20 nor more than \$300, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of said fine and costs shall be imprisoned in the county jail not to exceed 20 days.
