Chapter 284

PARADES AND ASSEMBLIES

[HISTORY: Adopted by the Village Board of the Village of Spring Green as §§ 15.23 to 15.26 of the Village Code. Amendments noted where applicable.]

§ 284-1. License required; fee. ¹

It shall be unlawful for any person, corporation, group or organization to hold or conduct a public or private meeting or parade on the streets or sidewalks of the Village without first procuring a license therefor in the manner hereinafter set forth and without first obtaining permission by the Village Board.

§ 284-2. Application for license.

Application for any license required by § 284-1 shall be in writing and filed with the Village Clerk-Treasurer, which application shall state in detail the nature and character of the meeting or parade, the names and addresses of the sponsors, the date or dates for which license is desired, and the location of the premises or the route intended to be used. All such applications shall be presented to the Village Board for approval or rejection. The proper license fee shall be paid to the Village Clerk-Treasurer prior to the issuance of any license.

§ 284-3. Violations and penalties. ²

Any person who shall violate any provision of § 284-1 or 284-2 shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than \$20 nor more than \$300, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of said fine and costs shall be imprisoned in the county jail not to exceed 20 days.

§ 284-4. Term and contents of license.

All certificates of license shall be signed by the President and countersigned by the Clerk-Treasurer and have attached thereto the Corporate Seal of the Village. The term for which such license is granted shall be definitely set out in the certificate thereof, and there shall be kept in the office of the Village Clerk-Treasurer a record of all licenses issued stating to whom issued, for what purpose, the date and hour on which such license shall begin and end, and the amount paid therefor.
